In the waning days of our sight loss journey it became quite obvious that there may be some things that we just wouldn't be able to do any more. Our minor inconvenience has finally become a real life problem. Now it was time to actually deal with it. I was confronted with this stark reality last summer when I got lost in my very own yard, a yard that I had worked on and landscaped every square foot of. I stood there not knowing which way to go. I remember mumbling "don't be afraid, dummy, you can figure this out." I did get back to the house and resolved to take something to probe with from then on, be it my cane, a shovel, a rake, or just a stick.

The lesson I learned that day and which I'd like to share with each of you is to DON'T BE AFRAID! You can do it, if you let your other senses kick in and allow other people to help you. Just DON'T BE AFRAID to ask for help when you need it. If you don't keep going you'll lose your self-respect and soon become irrelevant. Don't let yourself bottom out; instead take heart in the little victories you achieve each day. Use them to balance out the negatives you have to deal with. Losing your sight may be very tiring so get a good night's sleep and DON'T BE AFRAID to take a nap when you need one. Also, I have found that helping others can quickly lift one's spirits and help get you thru a troubled time. DON'T BE AFRAID to go thru this journey without a fight, as you will regret it if or when "your lights go out" for good.

Museum Focus Group

Last July members from the low vision support groups from Powell (SOS) and Cody participated in a focus group at the renowned Buffalo Bill Center of the West (BBCW) located in Cody. The Center is participating in a Multi-Site Museum Accessibility Study conducted by the Art Beyond Sight Institute.

The purpose of this Study is to collect information from blind and visually impaired persons which will help the Center design more educational and engaging programs for future visitors from around the world. A brief summary of their comments includes:

- The lighting in the hallways and galleries is low, which makes it difficult to walk around the Center.
- The push-button audios at some displays made it nice for those who can't see well enough to read.
- Push-buttons with contrasting colored circles would make it easier to locate the buttons.
- One on one, or tours in small groups were preferred.
- Video or audio pre-tours prior to entering the galleries would be very helpful.
- These folks were more likely to visit in the off season.
